

EDMUND PARK FROME TRAVEL INFORMATION PACK

Introduction

Welcome to Edmund Park.

Welcome to your new home. As you settle in to a new location, we would like to assist you to make the move as easy as possible.

This Travel Information Pack sets out the different transport options that are available to residents of Edmund Park and provides information to assist you in making sustainable choices about the way in which you travel.

The Travel Information Pack has been produced as part of a Travel Plan which has been prepared for Edmund Park. The main objective of the plan is to reduce the car travel to and from Edmund Park.

Local Facilities

Frome has a range of retail facilities, employment, leisure and education including Oakfield Academy, Wessex Lodge School, Steiner Academy, 6 primary schools, and 2 special education schools. In addition Frome features shops, restaurants, a museum, a leisure centre, a cricket club and a memorial theatre.

Walking and Cycling

Walking is one of the simplest, easiest, and cheapest ways to get around. This is particularly true at Edmund Park where good quality, direct and well lit pedestrian routes are provided throughout the development. It is also easy to cycle around Frome via on and off road routes which link directly to the Town Centre and other local facilities.

The distance from entry to Edmund Park to the nearest key facilities and services are shown in the table below, along with approximate time taken to travel on foot and by bicycle.

Walking or cycling can often be combined with other modes of transport for part of the journey, e.g. bus or train.

As the development progresses further pedestrian and cycle links will be provided into and around the site.



The availability of attractive public transport services provides opportunities for sustainable travel over longer distances complementing the provision of pedestrian and cycle links for shorter journeys.

The National Cycle Route NCR 24 passes directly through Frome Town Centre. It has 2 main routes, both beginning in the south of the town at Feltham Lane via the B3092.

Route 1 travels west of Frome along Lower Keyford via Somerset Road via Oakfield Road and exists the town at Egford Lane. Route 2 travels north along the B3092 via Locks Hill, Portway and Tucker Close. It travels west at River Court along the river via Willow Vale to Welshmill Lane. Here the route goes 2 separate ways: one heads north east and finishes at the top of Grange Road. The other travels west meeting route 1 at Somerset Road at follows route 1 from here.

NCR 24 runs from Bath through Radstock, Frome, Warminster and Salisbury to join with the NCR 23 at Eastleigh in Hampshire. NCR 24 includes Colliers Way, which connects Dundas Aquaduct and Frome.

Public Transport

Bus Services

Public Transport can be more convenient, quicker, and cheaper than travelling via car and provides environmental benefits too. Car journeys contribute a significant amount towards our overall carbon footprint.

Public transport can be quicker, especially as more investment is made into the public transport network. If you regularly travel the same journey or if you are planning in advance you can make cost savings as the cost of running a car is more than just the cost of petrol.

Public transport can mean no car insurance, ta MOT or car maintenance.

Public transport does not require looking for a parking space upon arrival at your destination or the expensive cost of parking.

The nearest bus stop at Edmund Park is at Caxton Road approximately a 12 minute walk from the site entrance. The number 30 bus service operates from Caxton Road bus stop. The bus route is shown below.





Rail Services

Frome train station is located approximately 0.4 miles west of the Edmund Park, around a 9 minute walk. The station is managed by First Great Western.

Frome train station provides access to a range of inter-city and regional train services. Direct access to the railway station is available via Warminster Road.

- The most fuel-efficient driving speed, where permitted, is in the highest gear at approximately 50mph – this can cut your fuel bill by about 30%.
- You can further reduce your fuel bill through adopting a smoother driving style, avoiding sudden braking or acceleration.
- Keep your car well maintained including keeping your tyre pressures to the appropriate level, check the air filters and get your vehicle regularly serviced.
